What we've bid, and will be bidding...

- We were the low bidder on the new ODNR Watercraft Office being built at the Green-up Locks and Dam, adjacent to the Rest Area on the Ohio side of the dam. Work should start on this project, in December 2009.
 - We were the low bidder on the Norfolk & Southern Crew Facility. Some site work has begun on this project. We should begin Electrical work next month.
 - We were the low bidder on the Wayne National Forest – Oak Hill Campground Renovations Project. This work should begin right after the first of the year.
 - We were recently awarded a subcontract from Mechanical Construction, for electrical work at the Portsmouth WWTP.
 - We will be bidding the electrical package for Washington-Nile's new Middle School. Plans will be available the first of December 2009. The tentative bid date is January 6, 2010.
 - We will be bidding the Electrical package on the Clay Local School District's new K-12 School facility. We've been told the plans would be available in January 2010, and the tentative bid date is February 15, 2010.
 - We are planning on bidding the new K-12 School facility, for New Boston Local School District. We've been told these plans would be out sometime next year.
 - We were the low bidder on the Electrical package for the Nile Township Fire Station to be built on US Route 52, West of State Route 125; adjacent to the Nile Township Community Center. We are still waiting on this project to be awarded. We've been told the trustees are waiting for the stimulus money.
 - We recently bid a site package for the Ironton Local School District. No word on this bid yet.
 - We recently bid the electrical for the new pop's Restaurant in Wheelersburg. No word on this bid yet.
 - We recently bid the Electrical for the new Chatham Steel Facility in Lawrence County, Ohio. No word on this bid yet.
 - We recently bid the new MRI at the Portsmouth KDMC Medical office building. No word on this bid yet.
 - We recently bid the Electrical work on an addition and renovations project at Greenup County High School. We are waiting on the final decision on this project.
 - We recently bid the Electrical on the Farm Bureau Office in Flemingsburg, Ky. No word on this bid yet.
